The Town of Golden is working to develop a community wide Transportation Plan to help shape the future of transportation in Golden over the next 20 years.

Residents are invited to provide their input through an online survey from January 26 to February 11 at <u>golden.ca/transportationplan</u>. The purpose of the survey is to share the main components of the draft transportation plan and gather feedback on prioritization and implementation of the plan prior to compiling the final draft plan.

Public Hearing - OCP Amendment Bylaw No. 1461 2021 – Corridor: On January 11, <u>a public</u> hearing was held regarding a proposed amendment to the Official Community Plan (OCP) that will provide policy context for the consideration of up to six storey structures in the Corridor Development Permit Area 4 by application for development variance permit (DVP).

Council received written correspondence from seven residents in advance of the public hearing. Concerns were expressed in regards to views, traffic, slope instability, height and wildlife.

Council will consider the adoption of the proposed amendment at the February 1 Council meeting.

Dog Licencing

Don't forget to renew your dog license! Licensing your dog (and making sure they wear their identification tag) is their ticket back home if they sneak out or wander off.

Every year over 200 dogs are licensed in the Town of Golden and it can cost as little as \$13. Dog licenses are required by the Town, they must be renewed each year and displayed on your dog's collar.
